## Definitions

1. “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began the program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all the students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
2. “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
3. “Number of On-Time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the program length within the reporting calendar year.
4. “Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
5. “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
6. “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.



## **STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL**

You have the right to cancel your agreement for a program of instruction, without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first class session or the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time, and you have the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60% or less of the instruction.

Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at the following address: 2010 Fortune Drive, San Jose, CA 95131. This can be done by mail or by hand delivery.

The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement. If the Enrollment Agreement is cancelled, the school will refund the student any money he/she paid, less the General Fees, within 45 days after the notice of cancellation is received.

You may withdraw from the school at any time after the cancellation period (described above) and receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled hours in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance. The refund will be less a registration fee, and less any deduction for equipment not returned in good condition. If the student has completed more than 60% of the period of attendance for which the student was charged, the tuition is considered earned and the student will receive no refund.

For the purpose of determining a refund under this section, a student shall be deemed to have withdrawn from a program of instruction when any of the following occurs:

- The student notifies the institution of the student's withdrawal or as of the date of the student's withdrawal, whichever is later.
- The institution terminates the student's enrollment for failure to maintain satisfactory progress; failure to abide by the rules and regulations of the institution; absences in excess of three (3) weeks; and/or failure to meet financial obligations to the School.
- The student fails to return from a leave of absence.

For the purpose of determining the amount of the refund, the date of the student's withdrawal shall be deemed the last date of recorded attendance. The amount owed equals the daily charge for the program (total institutional charge, minus non-refundable fees, divided by the number of hours in the program), multiplied by the number of hours scheduled to attend, prior to

withdrawal. For the purpose of determining when the refund must be paid, the student shall be deemed to have withdrawn at the end of three (3) consecutive weeks.

If you have received federal student financial aid funds, you are entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

SVU will also refund tuition received by sending to a third party on the student's behalf such as application fees. If SVU cancels or discontinues a course or educational program, SVU will fully refund all charges. Refunds will be paid within 45 days of cancellation or withdrawal.

Note: Non-resident students of California are not eligible for protection under and recovery from the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF).
